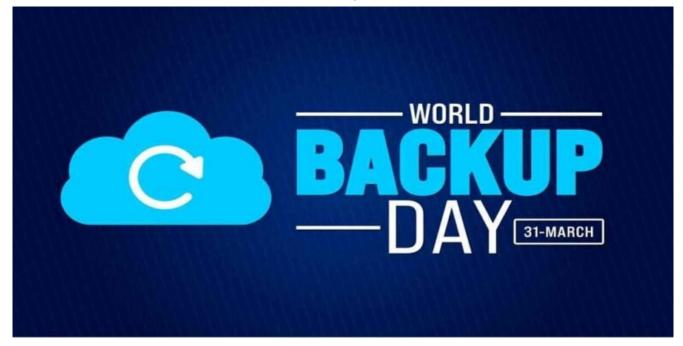
The Importance of Backing Up Your Data: Protecting Your Valuable Files and Documents
